

Narrative Story Guidelines

Dear Parents,

I have to ask for your assistance in the culmination of the American Revolution Narrative Story. We have focused on the events from the 1760's to the mid 1770's. We have ended historically during the war and will be discussing the Declaration of Independence and Bill of Rights soon.

The paragraphs for the story have been completed in steps over three weeks. Outlines, guides, examples, stories and more have been taught in class. Students and parent volunteers have edited their drafts, and in-class help has been given as well. In writing, however, continued editing is always encouraged and often necessary. The following is where we need your help to make sure that the requirements have been met for the final draft.

The requirements have been as follows:

- a. The story is about the beginning of the American Revolution.
- b. Historical facts are necessary and should be written throughout the story.
- c. Six paragraphs are required, but not limited to.
- d. Each paragraph should include the 5 W's (Who, what, when, where, and why).
- e. The students can create any character or creature.
- f. Their scratch art needs to be included in the story.

The final draft needs include the following:

- a. Ink or typed
- b. A title page – name, date, a title to the story
- c. Scratch art attached
- d. Pictures can be included
- e. Due Friday, January 23rd
